He ran into the garden, and there he saw a tree which seemed to say to him: "Come and cut me down!"




The Boy Who Cried Wolf




As Papa Fox kept on up the hill, he thought the bag was pretty heavy, but he said, "Never mind, she is a fat little red hen."



"Are you warm?"



Anna took the sack and a lantern from Father Frost and hurried home.


"What took you so long?" Lucy snapped. "I'm starving."

Father Frost scowled. He handed Lucy a heavy sack.


Lucy turned and headed home. She did not even say thank you.
