





"This is odd," Mr. Reed says. The children just smile.




What do the children have when they come back? Why do they yell?

Curt says, "We put the notes onto the balloon. They will make you think of us."






Now Mr. Reed is happy. He says, "This is no ordinary surprise!"

He ties the balloon to his bike. He rides home. The students wave. They will miss him.




